ABOUT

The Creative Dimension Trust (TCDT) offers fine craft skills courses to 14-18 year olds with exceptional talent and potential. The courses are taught by Craft Specialists who are acknowledged leaders in their professions.

The courses are designed to give young people the skills and confidence to pursue a career in which core hand skills - i.e. a high degree of manual dexterity, draughtsmanship and the ability to understand and (re)construct 3-Dimensional structures - are prerequisite. In addition to careers in creative and cultural industries, also included are professions such as architecture, engineering and surgery.

This is not a kid's art course – the goal is to learn, experiment, gain confidence, take inspiration from the best, and have exposure to career opportunities.

Courses are free of charge to all successful applicants and at least 80% of participants are selected from schools located in areas of social/economic deprivation or geographic isolation.




TCDT attained Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) status in April 2016.

WORKSHOPS

TCDT has been running for three-years and served more than 325 students.

All Workshops include a drawing and design component directed by Sarah Hocombe, an internationally renowned fresco painter.

"The Inspirational Hour" - where students are shown how the skills being taught link directly to our culture and heritage – is now part of TCDT workshops. This takes numerous forms, including visits to galleries, tours of venues, and talks from tutors, curators, and other specialists in related fields.

INNOVATION

The emphasis has been placed on creating fresh, diverse, and exciting offerings across a wide range of venues and locations.

New workshops include printing on glass, puppet making, flame working, sign writing, furniture and cabinet making, architectural model-making, and metal chasing in Essex, Lincolnshire, , Sunderland, Berkshire, and London.

Three workshops this summer delivered an exciting, highly motivating, and eye-catching new dimension, in that students not only learned but also made practical contributions to important conservation projects:

- Buckingham Palace: molded and gilded new banquettes for benches in the State Rooms
- Fortnum & Mason: restored and gilded the frontage of the flagship Piccadilly store
- Burghley House: restored and gilded the weather vane

Burghley House: The Process

TCDT is introducing textiles during the 2018/19 round of A tutu making workshop will be offered in partnership with the Royal Opera House. Students will design and make tutus under the tutelage the ROH's lead tutu maker at the costume department at the High House Production Park in Thurrock.

Another textile workshop is under design with Camden Costumes, who specialise in period costumes for stage and screen with credits including *The Crown*, *Peaky Blinders*, and *The Darkest Hour*. Students will either make a corset or learn embroidery.

ONGOING STUDENT SUPPORT

Students complete a questionnaire at the conclusion of each Workshop.

We monitor student use of TCDT work to support applications for further study or jobs.

Students are encouraged to enrol in further workshops to continue to broaden their horizons.

Our social media blogs encourage students to share experiences and encourage others to join workshops.

A number of students have remaining engaged by giving back as assistant tutors.

Our pilot work experience at Grimshaws' Architects was a great success. Two alumni followed a structured timetable covering many aspects of the role of an architect, and received a crit on the final day. We aim to expand on this in different areas to meet alumni needs.

FINANCES

TCDT is dependent on grants as students attend workshops free of charge.

As such, our fundraising efforts are extensive. We maintain a master spreadsheet with 60+ funders and potential funders which is reviewed, discussed, and updated constantly as the focus of our strategy.

We understand the importance of diversified funding sources. While only a new charity (registered in 2016), we already have twelve institutional funders.

We will not commit to any workshops without funding in place.

2017-18 AND UPCOMING WORKSHOPS

2018: MARIONETTE MAKING - LONDON

Dulwich College: five Saturdays from 10th November 2018 until 8th December 2018.

2018: ETCHING - LONDON

The City & Guilds of London Art School: five Saturdays, 10th November until 8th December.

2018: GLASS CASTING - SUNDERLAND

The National Glass Centre: five Saturdays from 6th October 2018 until 3rd November 2018.

2018: FLAMEWORKING - SUNDERLAND

The National Glass Centre: five days from Monday 30 July – Friday 3rd August 2018. Students were able to experiment with a range of techniques using specialist tools, lamps and Borosilicate glass rods where they worked together to create large geometric sculptures.

2018: STONEWORKING - LONDON

The Building Crafts College: five days from Monday 30th July to Friday 3rd August 2018. Students had the opportunity to learn to work with traditional stone-carving tools and explore some of the architectural principles of working with stone.
