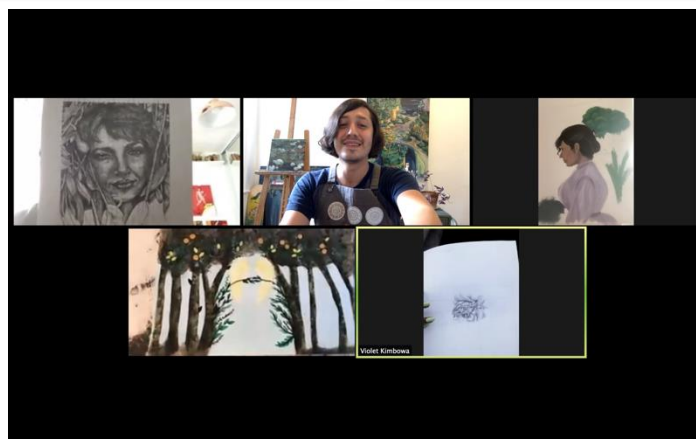
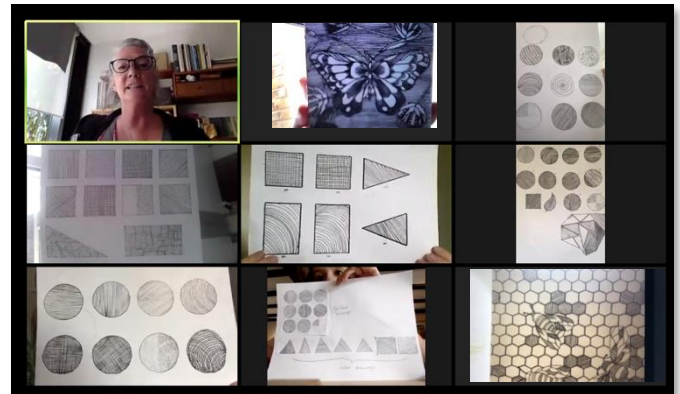
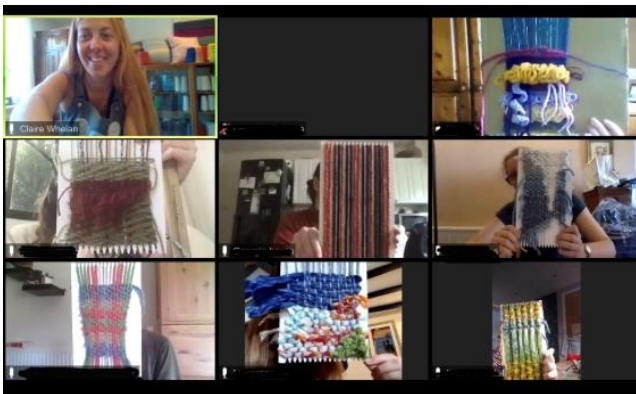


THE CREATIVE DIMENSION TRUST

TCDT took the positive, pro-active step of announcing a series of new on-line interactive Workshops on 23 March. TCDT remained determined to stay connected with students and expand engagement with new students at a time where young people were confined to home and their on-line curriculum was based on academia, not 3-D skills.

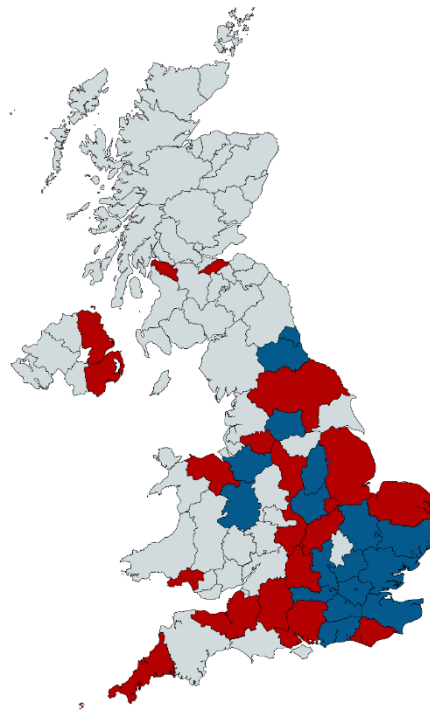
Our tutors responded to the project with such enthusiasm that launch took place within two weeks of school closures. The workshops were designed so students needed only everyday household materials to participate.

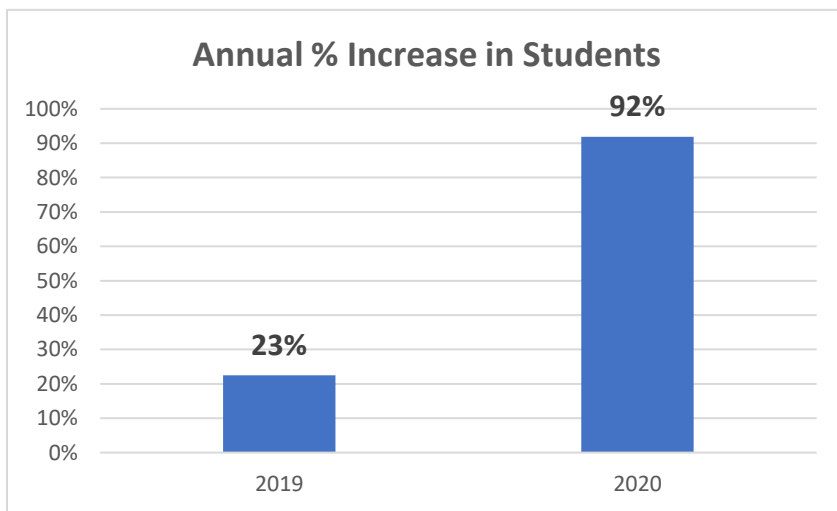
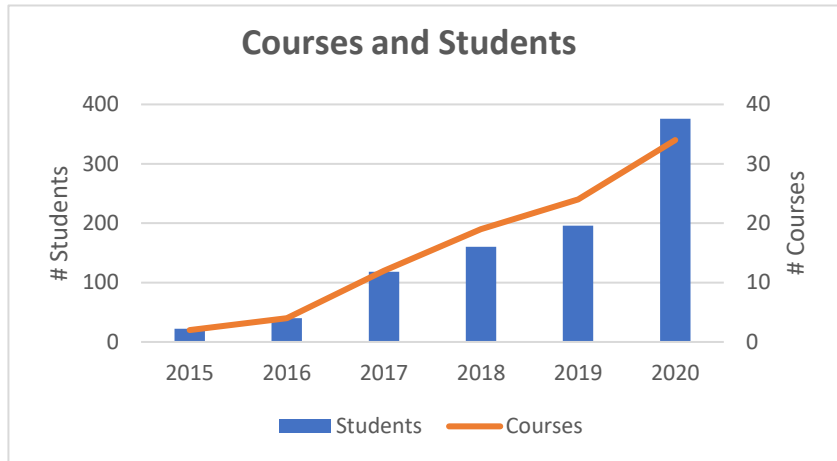

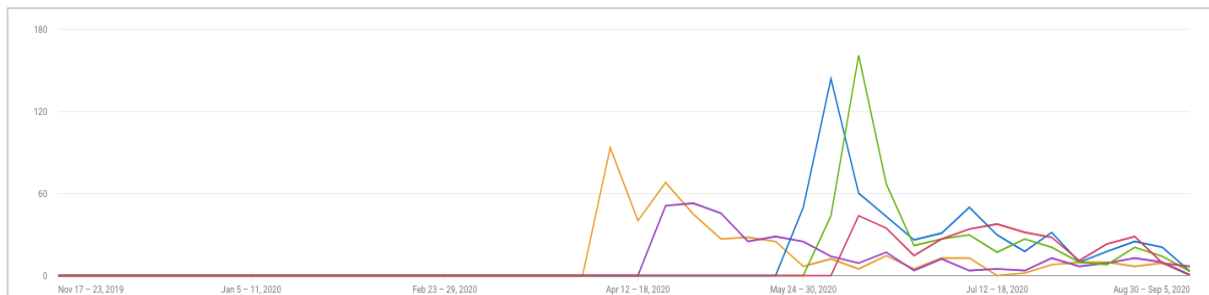

SPRING

Eight on-line workshops took place from 3 April – 4 July, which included 38 sessions:

- Puppet Making: Sian Kidd
- Architectural Model Building and Paper Folding: Adam Williamson
- Mask Making: Emma Brassington
- Grisaille: Sarah Hocombe
- Eco-Fashion Upcycling: Jose Hendo
- Eggshell Inlay: Rian Kanduth
- Building Up a Thematic Composition: Rene Gonzalez
- Geometric Drawing: Adam Williamson

Workshops started at 12.30 p.m. 3-4 times per week and ran for thirty minutes.

Applications received totalled 194.

Workshops have been uploaded on the website and Social Media platforms to create access for all (<https://www.thecreativedimension.org/ON-LINE-tutorials/>) .

Instagram followers have nearly trebled since launch of the on-line workshops to 5,500+.

Observations:

- On-line workshops have added geographic diversity and helped shielded children.
- Research has found that some children with problems in the classroom are performing better online.
- Tutors have shown great commitment by launching workshops within two weeks of lockdown, without previous on-line teaching experience.
- TCDT on-line workshops offer some skills not being taught anywhere else.



SUMMER

Summer workshops built on experience gained this spring

- Tutors submit lesson plans.
- Tutors follow guidelines on background room and noise.
- Tutors use techniques to get students to keep their video on and engage.
- Tutors will submit evaluation forms for student accreditation.
- Students will receive packs with materials.
- Students will be required to commit to attending all sessions.
- Students will submit post-workshop evaluations

The on-line format included pre-recorded teaching 10-11 a.m., practical work with tutor from 11 – 12.30 am, followed by scheduled 1-to-1 sessions in the afternoon. Parental consent was required for 1-to-1 sessions.

Three in person workshops still took place:

- AHM Architectural Modelling Making: 15 students have been interviewed on Zoom for two one-week placements.

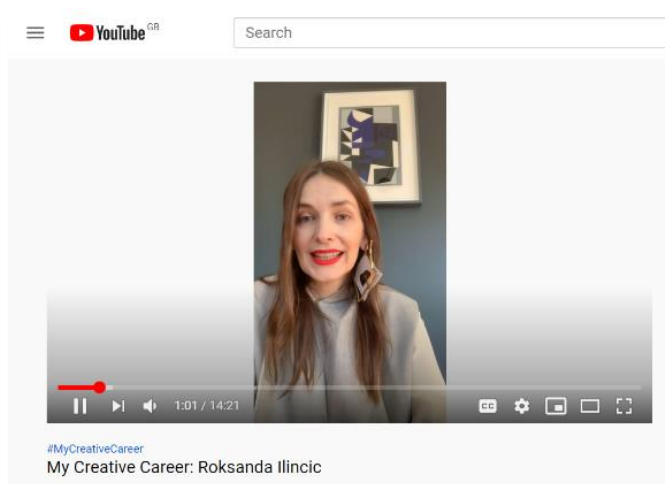

ACCREDITATION

In September 2019, TCDT assembled an expert committee of educators and employers to explore the concept of accreditation. The goal is to offer students the opportunity to earn a respected and valuable credential to aid their career progression.

After several meetings, the committee arrived at the purpose, requirements, administration, and grading of the credential.

The key is to evaluate whether a student has transformed a 2-D concept into a 3-D form, and how well they achieved it.

Grades will be awarded in technical skills, proficiency, studentship, quality of outcome (including “x factor”), completeness, and control.

Students can be recognised after just one workshop for excellent work, or for progression or sustained achievement over several. Every workshop and task is different, and grades can come in different ways each time.

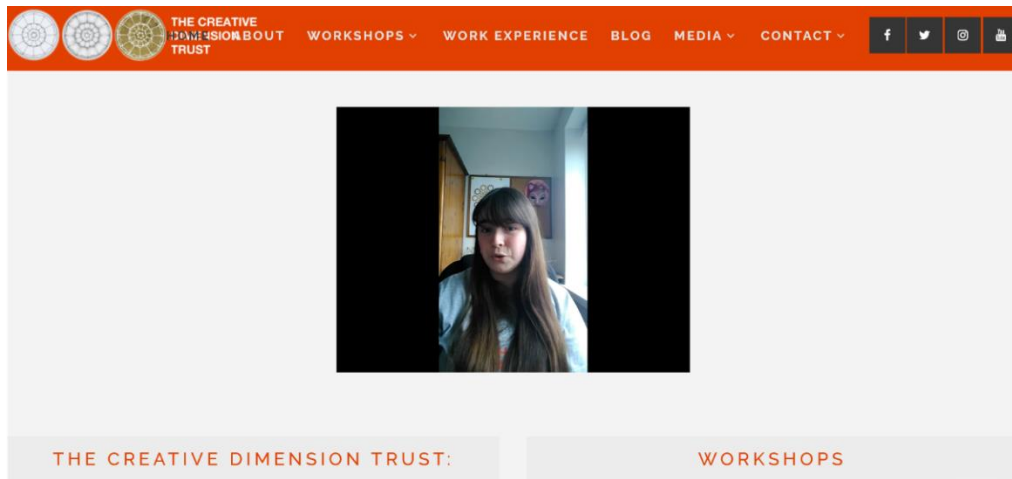
TCDT shadow piloted accreditation in 2020, with tutors asked to fill in a grid evaluation form for each student.

TCDT expects to fully launch accreditation in 2021.
